A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LA PAZ AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION(S) FOR FY 2018 STATE HOME FUNDS, CERTIFYING THAT SAID APPLICATION(S) MEETS THE COMMUNITY'S PREVIOUSLY IDENTIFIED HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT NEEDS AND THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE STATE HOME PROGRAM, AND AUTHORIZING ALL ACTIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT AND COMPLETE THE ACTIVITIES OUTLINED IN SAID APPLICATION

WHEREAS, the County of Paz County is desirous of undertaking housing rehabilitation activities; and

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona is administering the HOME Program; and

WHEREAS, the State HOME Program requires that HOME funds requested address one of the three Congressional mandated National Objectives; and

WHEREAS, the activities within this application(s) address the community's identified housing and community development needs, including the needs of low and moderate-income persons; and

WHEREAS, an Applicant of State HOME funds is required to comply with the program guidelines and Federal Statutes and regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of the County of La Paz authorize application to be made to the State of Arizona, Department of Housing for FY2018 HOME funds, and authorize the Chair of the Board of Supervisors to sign application and contract or grant documents for receipt and use of these funds housing rehabilitation activities throughout the County boundaries, and authorize the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors to take all actions necessary to implement and complete the activities submitted in said application(s); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this application for State HOME funds meets the requirements of low and moderate-income benefit for activities justified as benefiting low and moderate-income persons, aids in the prevention or elimination of slum and blight or addresses an urgent need which poses a threat to health; and
